Celebrate ***Summer Starry Nights*** with NSU Art Museum Fort Lauderdale. Every Thursday from June 25 through September 3 the museum is offering FREE admission from 4:30 – 8 pm. Beat the heat and enjoy exhibitions, lectures and films, along with wine and beer specials in the Museum Café.

Free *Summer Starry Nights* kicks off on Thursday, June 25 with the opening of the exhibition *From Within and Without: The History of Haitian Photography*. The exhibition provides the first comprehensive history of photography in Haiti and features more than 350 historic and contemporary images depicting Haiti's culture and people. Opening events include a panel discussion with guest curator, artist Edouard Duval-Carrié, and exhibition artists at 6 pm, followed by a reception from 7 – 9 pm. Also on view this summer at NSU Art Museum Fort Lauderdale are the exhibitions: *War Horses: Helhesten and the Danish Avant-Garde During World War II*; *Julian Schnabel: Portrait of Olatz*; *Pablo Picasso: Painted Ceramics and Works on Paper, 1931-71*; and *Selections from the William J. Glackens Collection*.

Located midway between Miami and Palm Beach in downtown Fort Lauderdale's arts and entertainment district, the Art Museum's distinctive 83,000 square-foot modernist building, which opened in 1986, was designed by renowned architect Edward Larrabee Barnes and contains over 25,000 square feet of exhibition space, the 256-seat Horvitz auditorium, museum store and cafe. Studio art instruction for all ages is offered at the Art Museum's acclaimed AutoNation Academy of Art + Design. Bonnie Clearwater, who became NSU Art Museum Fort Lauderdale's Director and Chief Curator in 2013, directs its international exhibition program, which aims to challenge viewers' perceptions of the world around them. In 2008, the Art Museum became part of Nova Southeastern University, one of the largest private, not-for-profit research universities in the United States.
